| B2 What are the reasons for the Decision? | The Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013 came into force on 1st October 2013. The Act repeals the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 1964 and those parts of the Vehicle (Crime) Act 2001 which deal with Motor Salvage Operators, to create a revised regulatory regime for scrap metal recycling and vehicle dismantling industries. |
| | Local authorities will continue to act as the principal regulator but the new Act gives authorities greater powers including the ability to refuse and revoke licences, where a dealer is considered unsuitable. In addition local authorities and Police have been given powers to enter and inspect premises. |
| | In order to effectively discharge the Council's duties and obligations a Statement of Policy and Guidelines for the Licensing of Scrap Metal Dealers was approved via EDR in 2013. |
| | The document sets out the Council's policy, as relevant local authority, on the regulation of Scrap Metal Dealers for the purposes of the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013. The policy proposes how applications will be dealt with and includes a Code of Practice which will apply to those licensed by the authority. The review was necessary to ensure the policy statement was still fit for purpose and to update the references from the Scottish Disclosure Service to the Disclosure and Barring Service. |
