B1 What is the Decision?	To remove Bond Street Car Park from the existing Parking order.
B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	Bond Street Car Park is owned by Burton and South Derbyshire College (BSDC). Currently, East Staffordshire Borough Council, with agreement from the College, operate a parking charge regime during the weekends as specified in the current Parking Order on Bond Street car park. Following a request from BSDC to end this agreement, Bond Street car park will no longer be available for parking at the weekends and therefore the Council will no longer be enforcing parking charges.
B2 Alternative options considered and rejected?	N/a – this is a request by BSDC re their facility.
