B1 What is the Decision?	To extend the current Rough Sleeper Outreach Service by 6 months, from 1 November 2022 until 1 May 2023, to enable a full procurement exercise, and handover / mobilisation where applicable.
B2 What are the reasons for the Decision?	 The Rough Sleeper Outreach Service is delivered by Burton & District YMCA under contract which is due to come to an end on 1 November 2022. In July 2022, Cabinet decided to continue the Rough Sleeper Outreach Service for a further 3 years until 1 November 2025. A scrutiny review of rough sleeper outreach services began in July 2022 and is yet to conclude. Procurement has been delayed to enable recommendations to be incorporated as appropriate. The scrutiny support officer has estimated that 6 months will be required for completion of the scrutiny review.


