It is expected that this arrangement will continue in the short term.
	However, the biodiversity guidance makes reference to mandatory biodiversity net gain, expected to come into place towards the end of 2023 and it is expected the level of resource required will increase given advice will be required for more application types. Also, schemes to provide net gain may need specialist advice as to their suitability. This will be considered as part of the development of the Medium Term Financial Strategy.
