**ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

This Licence is subject to the Mandatory Conditions set in Section 19 Licensing Act 2003 reproduced below:

**Mandatory Conditions - Supply of Alcohol**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence
  - (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence, or
  - (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is Suspended.
  
- (2) Every supply under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence

**Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Conditions) Order 2014**

- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - (b) "permitted" price is the price found by applying the formula  $P=D+(D \times V)$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
  - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(4) (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

**Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Conditions)(Amendment) Order 2014**

- 1 (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.  
  
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can be reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2 The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonable available.
- 3 The responsible person must ensure that-
  - (a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
    - (i) Beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) Gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
    - (iii) Still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made

aware that these measures are available.

**Mandatory condition: Door supervision**

1 Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:

- (a) Be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2003; or
- (b) Be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.

2. But nothing in subsection 1. Requires such a condition to be imposed:

(a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c21)(premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or

(b) in respect of premises in relation to:

- (i) Any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising films or under a gaming licence, or
- (ii) Any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

3. For the purpose of this section:

(a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act,

(b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

**ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE**

**General - all four licensing objectives**

**The prevention of crime and disorder**

**Conditions agreed with Staffordshire Police Licensing Unit on 18 July 2022:**

- CCTV must be installed and operating correctly to manufacturer's instructions internally and must cover all public entrances/exits and public areas where licensable activity takes place whilst the premises is open to the public.
- The time and date must be set to the correct time relating to BST/GMT
- A competent trained person in the use of and operation of the CCTV must be in attendance at the premises at all times that licensable activities take place and be able to fully operate the CCTV system to be able to download onto a CD/DVD/USB stick any information requested by any Responsible Authority within 24 hours of the request being made.
- All CCTV images must be retained for a period of not less than 28 days.
- Clear signage must be displayed at all entrances and exits indicating that CCTV is operating.
- CCTV recording equipment must be stored in a secure area or locked cabinet.
- CCTV must have a monitor to review images and picture quality.
- CCTV must be of sufficient quality that will enable the identification of patron's faces.
- An incident register of all occurrences of crime and disorder must be recorded. The register must be produced and made available at the time of the visit / upon request to any responsible authority.
- Prior to selling alcohol, all persons involved in the sale of alcohol and age restricted products who are not the holder of a Personal Licence must receive documented training by the Designated Premises Supervisor or external training provider with regards to the law in relation to the sale of alcohol and age restricted products. This will incorporate Challenge 25. Such training must be recorded and up to date training records of all such persons must be maintained at the premises and produced and made available at the time of the visit / upon request to any responsible authority.

- A written record / register must be kept on the premises by the Designated Premises Supervisor of every person employed as a door supervisor. The register must contain the full name, date of birth, full SIA badge number, home address or address details of the company employing them and an up to date contact telephone number. The register must be kept fully updated and available for inspection by Police or Local Authority at time of any visit.
- A duty sheet for every night that the door staff are employed will be completed and kept fully updated at all times. The sheet must include a signature from the member of staff at commencement and end of their duty. The duty sheet must also be made available to Police or Local Authority at time of visit / inspection.
- A minimum of one door supervisor must be present when the premises is open for trade on Fridays and Saturdays between the hours of 10pm and until the premises closes. The requirement for additional door staff or door staff on other occasions including Bank Holidays, Sundays before Bank Holidays, seasonal dates such as Christmas Eve and other special occasions must be risk assessed that risk assessment should be in written format and available for inspection by Police or Local Authority when required.
- Door Staff must wear black high visibility vests / jackets in order that they be clearly identifiable to Police when attending or viewing CCTV images.

- Staff and management will monitor all behaviour of visitors / customers at all times.

**Conditions agreed with Staffordshire Police Licensing Unit on 18 July 2022:**

- A challenge 25 policy must be adopted and enforced at the premises where all persons who appear to be under the age of 25 must be challenged for acceptable identification to prove they are over the age of 18 prior to the purchase of alcohol.
- Challenge 25 posters must be displayed at all entrances to the premises and at the cash till payment area. Posters must be displayed prominently and in sight of customers and staff.
- A refusals register with details of all refusals must be maintained at the premises. The register may be contained on the till but must contain details of the staff member refusing the sale and must be checked on a monthly basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and signed and dated by the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- The refusals register or when on the till a print out of refusals must be produced and made available for inspection at the time of the visit / upon request by any responsible authority.
